



Opioid Overdose Reversal Medication

Nasal spray that reverses a potential opioid overdose.

AED

Automated external defibrillator that revives people experiencing cardiac arrest. There are now 3.2 million AEDs in public places.

Both Save Lives!



Help increase access to opioid overdose reversal medication, especially in rural communities. This medication assists in preventing opioid overdoses and makes communities safer.

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Tips for Safe Opioid Overdose Reversal Medication Use

- Call 911 first, then administer opioid overdose reversal medication.
- Repeat opioid overdose reversal medication dosing if needed every two to three minutes if non-responsive.
- People who have been given opioid overdose reversal medication should

- be observed constantly until emergency care arrives.
- Opioid overdose reversal medication is not a replacement for emergency medical care.
- Opioid overdose reversal medication is only active for 30-90 minutes in the body.
