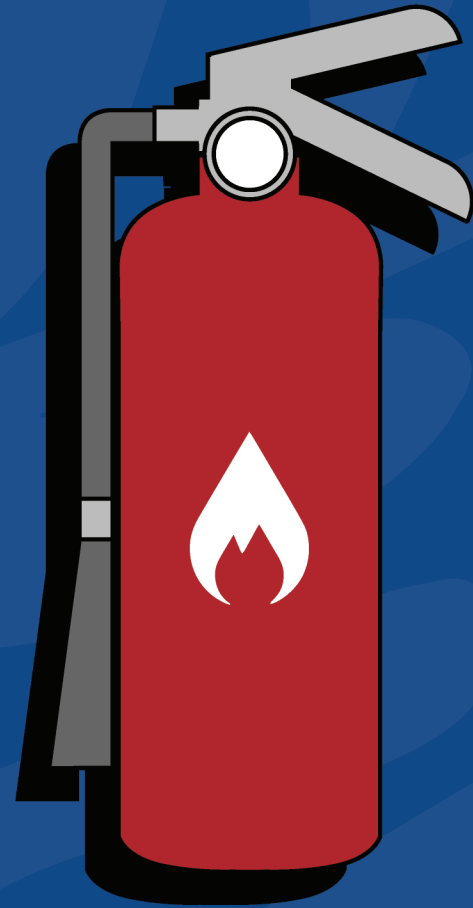


Opioid Overdose Reversal Medication

Be Prepared

GOAL:

Help increase access to opioid overdose reversal medication, especially in rural communities. This medication assists in preventing opioid overdoses and makes communities safer.

5 Tips for Safe Opioid Overdose Reversal Medication Use

- Call 911 first, then administer opioid overdose reversal medication.
- Repeat opioid overdose reversal medication dosing if needed every two to three minutes if non-responsive.
- People who have been given opioid overdose reversal medication should be observed constantly until emergency care arrives.
- Opioid overdose reversal medication is not a replacement for emergency medical care.
- Opioid overdose reversal medication is only active for 30-90 minutes in the body.
